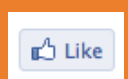

Hutt Street Centre has a new logo—see top left of the front page. It retains the image of Jan which has become synonymous with HSC. Jan was a client here back in the 80's. He was a Polish immigrant who lived in the South Parklands and was supported by HSC for a number of years. He was assisted into nearby housing by our social workers at the time.

Although HSC provides for men and women, young and old, we feel the image of Jan symbolises the facelessness of homeless people and the loss of not just belongings but their individualism and sense of community.

HSC offers people hope, a light at the end of the tunnel, a community and a gentle way of uncovering their story and discovering their strengths. We feel the new logo with stronger and clearer type face, the warmth of the orange colour and the incorporation of the image of Jan represents us well and will be a strong and broadly recognised logo.
